OLDER DOGS

Our dogs age at different rates. It's our job to note the signs that they are slowing down. One sign might be moving slowly, having difficulty getting up from a down position, and having a problem navigating the stairs. It's a good idea to talk with your veterinarian for the best kind of treatment. Just remember they still will want to continue doing things they enjoy. They just may not be able to do them as often or as energetically.

I personally have an aging dog – my Zach is eleven. The biggest thing we have noticed is his hearing or lack of – we estimate he is 95% deaf. Knowing that, we have to be aware of where he is for his safety. We have to show him by touch as to what we want him to do or not do; what direction to go when walking. This is where having taught him hand- signals has been a godsend.

A humorous side of it all takes place when we have a snack in the evening. Zach can be sound asleep in another room. I have observed him lift up his head, seemingly from a deep sleep, take a number of long sniffs, arise and come immediately to the chair of the snackee!! It is truly amazing that his sense of smell is still so strong.
