Doree is part of a non-profit organization, [ERK9](#) that went to Turkey in 2002 to help train search dogs and their handlers to FEMA standards for disaster situations. Doree and her 10 year old Border Collie Faith recently passed an air scent certification held in Cooks Forest by the North American Search Dog Network. Faith had thirty minutes to search 6.6 acres but Faith completed the task in just over two minutes, receiving the maximum number of points in the test. Faith is also certified with FEMA as a disaster search dog.

CHILL OUT!

If you have a very active dog, and are constantly looking for ways to calm him down, here are some ideas.

Some suggestions from The Whole Dog Journal.

- Outings to a local **well-run** dog park or a doggie day-care facility, or take him to a doggie day-care center once a week.
- Invite yourself over to your dog-friend's fenced yard for play dates.
- Play with your dog on a 50-foot line. Work up to 50 feet gradually, so he learns where the end the line is. Also wear long pants in case the line gets wrapped around your bare legs.
- Have him wear a pack when on a walk
- Play the "Find it" game

Hide treats in various parts of the house while he does a sit-stay. Then have him find them. At first use easy to find places; then gradually work up to more difficult places.

Put him in another room and hide the treats. Bring him back and instruct him to "find it". Be sure to help him/her if they are unable to find the treats. This is a form of mental exercise that can also be very tiring.
