

TAKE A BOW

When teaching your dog to bow, he will only achieve the correct bow position for a split second. It is crucial to give him the treat while he is in the correct position, and not after he stands back up.

TROUBLESHOOTING

- 1. If your dog sits instead of bows, you are probably holding the treat too high. Press it toward your dog and downward, toward his back paws.
- 2. If your dog lies down, you may need to release the treat sooner, before is elbows even touch the ground. If this doesn't solve the problem, position your foot on the floor under his belly.
- 3. If your dog keeps backing up, you may be pushing the treat backward, but not downward. You can also try lightly resting your hand on his shoulders.

The bow position is a great stretching exercise for your dog. Gently try these leg stretches with your dog.

- 1. Hold your dog's elbow with one hand, and his wrist with the other. Gently move the leg forward and upward, stretching the elbow and shoulder joints.
- 2. Place one hand directly above his knee joint and your other hand on the lower part of his leg around the hock joint. With his knee bent, use your hand above his knee to lift his leg gently upward and backward.
