The Petit Prix

Keystone had the honor of co-sponsoring the Petit Prix at the B & D Creekside training facility on October 26th, 27th and 28th. Splash 'n Dash (in the Monroeville area) was the other co-sponsor. Between the 3 facilities we provided all the workers to make this event a success. There were seventyseven handler-dog teams in attendance, some of them from our own club. The Petit Prix is a national event sponsored by the Teacup Dog Agility Association. A dog only has to have competed once in TDAA to be eligible to participate in the event. There were 10 different events over the 3 days and many of the courses were very tricky. Keystone was responsible for the Distance Challenge. This event measures how far a handler can

send their dog to a tunnel. The furthest distance was over 100 feet! Splash 'n Dash was responsible for the Weave Pole Challenge which times how fast the dog can do 24 weave poles correctly. The winning time was less than 5 seconds! As you can probably tell, there were some pretty fast dogs in attendance.

The Keystone members that participated did very well. Their new titles are:
