KCTC MEMBERSHIP MEETING July 15, 2012

NEW MEMBER

Stacy Podplesky was voted in unanimously.

MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

The Board can modify the regularity of the membership meetings without any changes to the Bylaws. Therefore, the plan is to reduce the frequency of membership meeting to every-other month. The membership meetings will be held on the odd numbered months. We do not meet in December. The changes do not affect the annual election in May; however, nominations from the floor will take place in March rather than April.

SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP

This will be a new classification in the Bylaws. This membership is for individuals who do not have a dog or who do not enroll in classes, but wish to remain active with the club. These individuals will pay \$35.00 instead of \$70.00 (50% of annul dues) but if they get a dog and wish to enroll in classes they would have to pay the full membership fee.

MEMBERSHIP

A person must enroll in two sessions of classes prior to applying for membership. The applicants for membership will be eligible for the members' rates for classes after they have taken the two class sessions and after receipt of their application for membership. The members in attendance voted to approve Bylaw changes to reflect the new Social Membership category and the policy about eligibility for members' rates for classes.

AKC STAR PUPPY PROGRAM

This program has been implemented with Session IV.

NEW BUSINESS

Ed Hanke is donating a refrigerator to the club.

There are a number of lights throughout the building that need to be replaced and Dave Wray has agreed to replace these lights.

All dogs should be taken to the Potty area prior to attending a class. All instructors and/or assistants are asked to check the building for any "accidents" after each class.

During the membership meeting on August 19, the attached revision of the Bylaws was approved. The major changes are as follows:

- Added a Social Membership category for current or previous members who do not have a dog and do not take classes. The dues are 50% of the regular dues.
- Clarified that a person must complete two classes prior to applying for membership.
- To reflect current policy, stated that applicants for membership are eligible for members' rates for classes after taking two classes and after receipt of their application for membership by the Membership Chair.
- Changed the dates of various actions regarding elections, to reflect an every-other month membership meeting schedule.

MEETING DATES

Although not a Bylaw change, we will now hold membership meetings every-other month instead of monthly. We will meet in odd-numbered months. The next meeting will be September 16, and the following meeting will be November 18.

Our annual Holiday party and awards banquet will be held Monday, December 3 at the Royal Place on Route 88.
