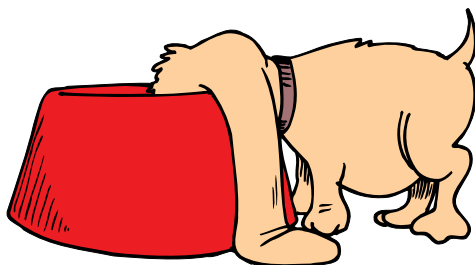
If you joined in the previous fiscal year, your dues will be prorated. Clare will send you (or has sent you) an email informing you how much you owe.

Session IV will be starting shortly. Please note that we have added some new classes and have made some changes to other classes.

- 1) **Tricks Class** – Mondays at 4:00 pm. This class for fun and more! Your dog can earn trick titles thru the Kyra Sundance Website <http://domorewithyour-dog.com> We have found this class to be fun, surprising and unbelievable as to what you can teach your dog to do. Go on line and look at the website and the requirements needed to earn Trick Titles.
- 2) **AKC Open Obedience** – Thursdays at 7:30 pm. This class will prepare dogs and handlers for AKC Open Obedience. We will prepare you for Graduate Novice, Pre-Open and/or Open Trials. This class is for anyone who wishes to continue to work with their dog. (Prerequisite – AKC Novice Title or Equivalent)
- 3) **Advance Agility** – Wednesdays at 6:30 pm. This class was added to help relieve the overload on the Tuesdays Advance Agility Classes. It will use the Tuesday Advance Agility setup.

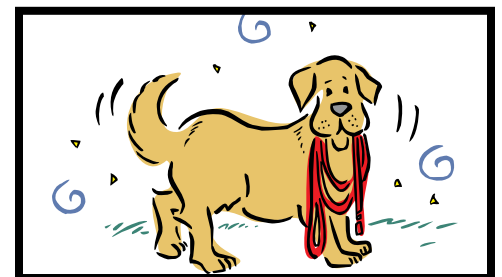
There will be more info to follow as we get closer to our "game nights" (ok, ok, weekends) but feel free to see either of us with any questions you might have.

Alcohol



Common household items that are harmful to your dog:

Weed killers

Windshield-wiper fluid



Symptoms of possible poisoning are: vomiting, diarrhea, difficult breathing, abnormal urine (color, aroma or odor, frequency, etc.), salivation, weakness. If your dog should ingest harmful chemicals, contact a veterinarian or poison control center immediately.
