In early 2013 Lucy McCloskey brought to the attention of her students between Saturday night agility and rally classes that there was a program in which a dog could earn titles for dog tricks. We started to practice and earn titles through that organization-Do More With Your Dog-a program originated by dog tricks advocate Kyra Sundance. Kyra wrote many fine books on the subject, which became the basis of the curriculum I adapted for formal dog tricks classes at KCTC.

Now going forward, Dog Tricks classes have been taught for nearly four sessions with great success.

How does one earn a title? One needs a person to witness the completion of the assigned number of tricks. Then the applicant must send in paperwork and a fee to DMWYD to receive an official diploma/title and posting on DMWYD website.

Dog Tricks continued

The owner and dog work at their own pace and become witnessed when they are ready. The witness must have knowledge of what comprises good execution of the trick-and should only witness at that time.

The four witnessed title tiers are: **NTD** (Novice Trick Dog) **ITD** (Intermediate Trick Dog) **ATD** (Advanced Trick Dog) **ETD** (Expert Trick Dog)

Then the highest tier - which needs a video sent to DMWYD to pass: **TDCH** (Trick Dog Champion).
