Protect Your Pets!

It was a typical work day morning, rushing to get everything done before leaving. One of the usual tasks was letting my ten-year-old terrier, Duke, out after eating his breakfast. As I hurried out the front door, the last thing I always did was give Duke a treat from his treat jar that was sitting on the counter by the door.

I returned home from work nine hours later. When I opened the door, I was not greeted by my happy boy. This was very unusual as he always was there barking and wagging like mad. The eerie quiet of the house made the hair on my neck stand on end. As I walked into the kitchen, to my horror, I found Duke. He had somehow knocked the plastic treat jar off the counter. His lifeless body lay on the floor with his head stuck in the treat jar.

This is unfortunately a true story. It is unknown how many pets die from suffocation every year.

What can you do to help make everyone more aware of preventing pet suffocation?

- Keep all plastic containers, chip bags and food bags safely stored away from your dog's reach.
- Tear / cut up / pop all chip bags and food bags after use.
- Keep all trash can lids tightly fastened, locked, or behind a cabinet, especially in the kitchen.
- Keep kitchen pantry door closed.
- Learn CPR for pets. How to do CPR on a Dog or Cat.

- Do not allow your pets to roam freely in the house while you are away.
- Alert all your friends and family about the suffocation dangers of bags and plastic containers.
- Lobby to companies like Frito Lay and other snack, cereal, and dog food manufacturers to put warning labels on their bags. Or in the case of treat jars only buy wide mouthed ones.
- Store pet treat safely in cabinets out of reach of your pet.

If your pet's head does get stuck in a plastic container. Cut the bottom open to allow air in first. In the time that you waste attempting to pull the jar off his/her head they can suffocate.
