What we are needing now is donations for the baskets. The purple bin is


In the entrance area. If you are donating money, please place it in the mail box in the office. If you and or your family have a favorite side

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Halloween is a night for ghosts, goblins, witches and other costumed creatures, but the "scary" stuff should be fun, rather than genuinely frightening.

The constant ringing of doorbells and the appearance of costumed strangers may be viewed as a home invasion by some dogs and cats. They can bolt out the door and be lost in the night, or they could bite or scratch Halloween visitors.

So here's a list of safety tips provided by Animal Friends:

- Most pets would be happier behind closed doors in a quiet room well away from the tricks and treats.
- Costumes and masks can scare pets. Animals are suspicious of new things such as masks and tall, pointy witch and wizard hats.
- Most people know that chocolate can make dogs and cats very sick. Not as many people know the artificial sweetener Xylitol can also be deadly. It's in baked goods and some kinds of candy, including lollipops and hard candy, so keep the Halloween candy away from pets.
- The crinkly wrappers that cover small pieces of hard candy can pose a choking hazard. There's also a small chance they could cause an intestinal blockage if swallowed.

If you want to give your pet a treat on Halloween, give them a safe pet treat.

We have a few more updates for the Saturday Night Fun Classes.


