
We always need 2 salads for each trial day. A donation of a salad would help round out our menu.

Comfort for Critters is a volunteer program that creates free handmade blankets to comfort homeless pets living in animal shelters across the US. We support over 100 shelters in every US state! While these pets await adoption, the blankets provide a comfortable bed year-round. When they are adopted, their blanket goes with them, providing something familiar as they adjust to their "forever family."

There's so much to be thankful for this month, and it's all because of YOU. We were able to provide almost 900 blankets to shelters, just during the month of June! I remember when we'd deliver that many blankets over the course of a year! I've also come to realize that I need to spend more time on fundraising, as I expect this number to grow. I'd love to find a way for non-crafty people to support our mission! Please continue to share our newsletters, our Facebook posts, etc. as I try to reach out and raise funds! If you read nothing else in this newsletter, please read the first thank you note under "Shelter Thank You's", it's very cute and warms my heart every time I read it! You may also want to check out the article on "House with a Heart," whom we are now supporting. You may remember my Facebook post on this great organization. It's wonderful that we have a way to help them, help older pets! I also wanted to share some pictures from a Bible study group who recently supported us by making 25 beautiful blankets. I know that during the summer, many Bible study groups postpone their weekly meetings and just get together a couple times socially. With this in mind, I wanted to plant an idea that if you're part of a Bible study, or any similar group, making blankets may be a fun activity! Linda Cordle (a Keystone Canine Club member) of Carnegie, PA, contacted me about her Bible study and shared the pictures shown along the right side. Not surprisingly, she reports that all the ladies in her group are huge animal lovers! They hope that "the beautiful blankets can draw attention to the beautiful pets available for adoption!" Linda has been making blankets for homeless people for 10 years, so now she's decided to expand and help homeless pets as well. We're glad she did! Remember, even if some members can't knit or crochet, fleece blankets are easy and fun to make!
