### Fenzi Class Review

We are all looking for something to do these days. I decided to take advantage of the Education credit offered to instructors. I participated in a Fenzi Workshop titled Maintaining Attention, Connection and Confidence at a Distance. It was led by Petra Ford. That title and description sounded like something that could help Howie and me with some of the issues we have in Rally. Also the description said that much of it was done with games so I thought maybe I could use it in class.

The entire class was done with her dogs, and everything she talked about, she would demo with one of her dogs. I liked that she made a point that one method does not work for all dogs. She was doing it one way with the dog she had with her but would explain how she did it with her other dog. That is always a good reminder to me that what works for one does not work for all.

What I wanted more than anything from the webinar was to learn how to leave my dog, turn around and find that he still has his attention on me, he's not looking at the judge or sniffing the floor AND he was confident. Her method of doing that is to teach the dog to focus on your hand. He can do that when you have your back to him. It is of course done with food in the hand at first and it is taught slowly in baby steps. Each step was fun for the dog. I will definitely be working on this with Howie and will be using it in classes as well.

One last thing, I chose the webinar format because I have never taken a class online before and I don't know that I have the discipline for a six week class. The actual teaching portion of the class was a little over an hour and that was just right for me. They then did Q&A. The file remains in my account for one year so I can go back and review it.
