### February 27 - Mock ORT Trial

In anticipation of NACSW trials coming to our area, Keystone Canine Training Club will be holding a **Mock ORT** (Odor Recognition Test) on Saturday February 27, the day before our C-WAGS trial.

The National Association of Canine Scent Work (NACSW) requires successful completion of the Odor Recognition Test before trial entry into NW1. The ORT verifies the dog's recognition of the odor used in trial and the handler's ability to correctly call the location of the source of odor.

The ORT is comprised of three separate courses: one for each of the odors of birch, anise and clove. Each odor/course must be passed to earn the ORT title.

The Odor Recognition Test is a type of container search exercise, similar to C-WAGS Scent Patrol Level1. The ORT requires 12 closed cardboard boxes set up in a pattern of one or two rows with each box set a minimum distance of 4' apart from box edge to box edge. The time limit for each run is three minutes.

The ORT is a pass or miss test within the time limit. No scoring, faults, placements or times are recorded as they are for trials.

Act quickly! We are inviting KCTC members first, before the general public. The premium will be offered to the public on February 6, so please enter early for the best chance of acceptance. We are limiting entries to 30 handlers and dogs.

#### This is a MOCK ORT for practice in a trial environment.

We will set up all three odors according to NACSW rules.

This is not a real NACSW trial, this is to run through what a real ORT would be like.
