In Memory of Jack (May 8, 2008 – Jan. 26, 2022)

Anyone who has loved a dog knows – our time with them is never long enough. With Jack, that feels especially true as we got less than 3 years together, but I think we made the most of them.

After my aunt passed away, Jack stayed with my uncle on the farm until he needed help with a massive tumor on his shoulder. PVSEC got clean margins, but the recovery was hard. When Jack was left without his cone and opened up his stitches, it got worse. Jack rehomed with us as he went for 3x/week bandage changes. When the wound still wouldn't heal, we had a decision: let him go or do another, major graft surgery. Instead, we looked to laser therapy at our local vet as a last resort. In three initial sessions, the wound visibly started to shrink, and a few months later it finally closed.

After all that and six months in a cone, Jack was a member of our family. And, coming from the farm, he was a little unruly and leash reactive on walks. We walked at night with a light-up harness and started Family Manners classes at Keystone. This working dog loved having a job! After three sessions of Family Manners, his instructor suggested Rally Obedience. Jack really loved it and, after learning last fall that he had a small tumor on his spleen, we decided "Why not?" and entered the WCRL trial at Keystone. His two placements there were just about our proudest moments.

Jack lived for the daytime walks that were a gift of his Keystone training, his Barkbox Super Chewer toys and time with his family, especially my Italian greyhound Noah, with whom he had a special relationship. We never expected his tumor to start to bleed so suddenly, especially when we were just getting to the best part of our journey together. But I am so grateful to have had this unforgettable dog.

Thank you so much to his instructors – Clint, Rose and Bill in Family Manners I, Amy and Mary Jo in Family Manners II, Pat and Cole in Rally, and anyone I may have forgotten! – for being so welcoming and understanding of Jack, especially early on when being in a roomful of strange dogs was an accomplishment in itself. Thank you to every single classmate and friend who encouraged our training journey. You helped a wonderful boy have the golden years he deserved.
